You have the following options:

- **Print full section.** Be careful – *there is no point in printing articles in full*. We have purchased this online resource to provide students access to current information using today's digital formats. If you want to read a print copy – PLEASE SEE THE WORLD BOOK PRINT EDITION. We cannot print all the articles students read – IF STUDENTS ABUSE THIS, WE MAY NOT BE ABLE TO AFFORD TO CONTINUE OUR YEARLY SUBSCRIPTION.
- **View Article By Section.** This link expands the links to each section that appears on the LEFT of the screen. This makes it easier to browse through the content of the full article, identifying sections of information that are of interest. **NOTE:** *When you click on VIEW ARTICLE BY SECTION, this link changes to VIEW FULL ARTICLE (and the section guide on the left collapses).*
- **E-mail article.** You can send this article to any email address. Remember, using the district's login information, you can access *World Book Online* from any computer connected to the Web. In most cases, there will be no need to email articles *from World Book Student* – please use this feature only as needed.
- **Save to My Backpack.** Anytime you view an article, you can save it to your backpack. Clicking here gives you the option of saving it to an existing project or creating a new product.
- **Save article.** If you want to save an article to a local drive, network account, or flash-drive; clicking here will give you the option of saving as a.pdf file

(downloadable, printable version that is formatted for a piece of paper) or as an HTML file (Web-format, designed to view in a browser).

- **Double-click a word to define it.** Here's a great feature – a real "advantage". You can quickly check the meaning of any word with just 2 clicks of your mouse!

Related Information

When you view an article, on the **RIGHT** you will see links for related information. **NOTE:** *World Book Online displays best at monitor resolutions of 1024 X 768 or higher. Using smaller settings results in some of the navigation links being placed over other sections of the screen. This can hide or block access to sets of links.*
